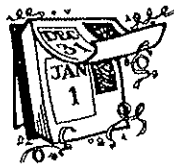

### **BICENTENNIAL TREE DEDICATION**

A beautiful new Red Sunset Maple tree now stands in the church yard. As it matures it will provide shade in summer and beauty in the fall. The green leaves will turn a brilliant orange-red in the fall. It's mature size will reach approximately 60 feet tall.

Several church members attended the dedication ceremony in the afternoon of Sunday, September 26. The tree was given to the Darrtown United Methodist Church by the people of St. Matthew Lutheran Church to honor the enduring and valued relationship between them and us.

*"We present this tree to be consecrated to the glory of Almighty God and for witness in this church yard to the respect and bond between the two congregations. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we consecrate this tree as a living memorial of this 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Darrtown United Methodist Church and the cherished friendship of St. Matthew Lutheran Church. Dear God, Grant us Your blessing as we dedicate this tree to Your glory. May this be a lasting symbol of Christian brotherhood and devotion and a witness before all Your people. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."*

### **SYMBOLIC DOVES CEREMONY**

On September 26<sup>th</sup> the tree dedication was immediately followed by the release of four beautiful white doves. Each dove represented something important in the 200 years of our Methodist history, plus the next 100 years to come. What a wonderful and uplifting sight to see the doves circle overhead against a bright blue sky!

*"The first dove (first dove released) represents the first 100 years of our church -- starting on December 14, 1810 in the Ohio wilderness with some of the early pioneers.*

The deed for our ancestral church provided for the Zion Meeting House and cemetery to be built on one acre in Oxford Township near Four Mile Creek. The log church and cemetery did not last long at this location, likely destroyed by a combination of fire and flood.

The Methodists came to Darrrtown, which was established in 1814, and had some of their services in the Town Hall built in 1826. The Town Hall lasted nearly 100 years and four denominations had services in the Hall at different times – Baptists, Presbyterians, Lutherans and Methodists. It is here that the Union Sunday School with the Methodists and Lutherans likely started.

In 1868, the Lutherans built the church they have today and in 1871, the Methodists built their present church. By 1900, the Methodists were out of debt.

Then in 1907, a tornado swept through Darrrtown and nearly destroyed the Methodist Church. The Lutherans offered their sanctuary to the Methodists while their church was being rebuilt.

**"The second dove** (second dove released) represents the second century for the Darrrtown Methodists – 1910 to 2010.

The horse and buggy disappeared and the automobile came on the scene. The church took a greater outreach role for local, national and international mission work. The world was coming to the doorstep. The church was no longer a backwoods venture.

Methodist pastors were often shared with Seven Mile or McGonigle as circuits changed over the years.

In 1955 and then again in 1962, the Methodists added social and Sunday School rooms and modern conveniences to the church. The day of the outhouse was gone.

The Union Sunday School with the Lutherans and Methodists was disbanded at this time. Both churches felt strong enough to go it alone.

**"The third dove** (third dove released) stands for the next 100 years – 2010 to 3010. No one knows what challenges lie ahead, but we, like other Christian churches, are ready to take them on. We shall proclaim **His Story** and remember that with God all things are possible. It will be **Onward Christian Soldiers** for our third century.

**"The fourth dove** (fourth dove released) represents the partnerships and friendships that we have had for many years with three churches – the St. Matthew Lutheran, the McGonigle Methodist, and the Seven Mile Methodist. We hope these cherished relationships will continue forever.

**"God bless and God speed as the symbols of our church fly heavenward."**

Looking at the year 2010, from its beginning to the present time, the activities associated with the United Methodist Church Bicentennial Celebration have been successful.
