Lent, 2012

Once upon a time a young prince was given a fine gun by his father. He taught him how to use it, but cautioned him not to hunt on the duck pond. Later, when the King went away on royal business the son shot and killed a prize duck on that very same pond.

One of the servants saw this and knowing of the King's feelings blackmailed the son until he had the prince as his own private servant.

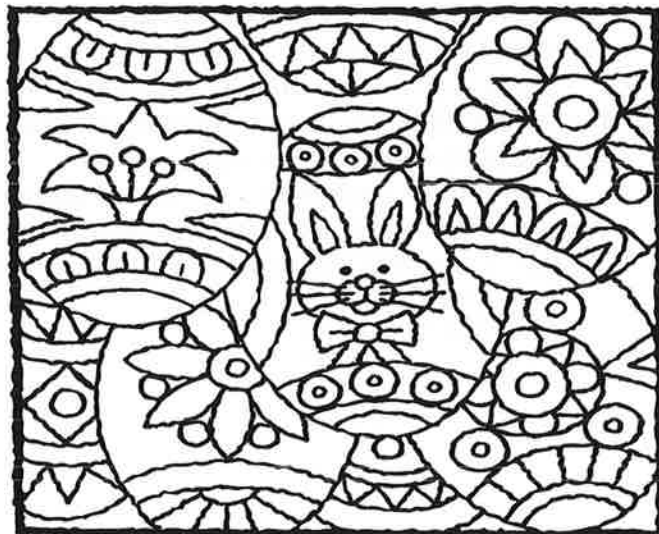

### **SUNDAY SCHOOL**

In Sunday School we are studying the book of Joshua. After Moses died, Joshua became the leader of Israel. Joshua's outstanding qualities were faith, courage, obedience and devotion to the law of God. God told Joshua to ***“cross this Jordan, you and all this people, to the land which I am giving to them, to the sons of Israel.”*** The people of Israel followed the priests carrying the ark of the covenant. When the priests stepped into the fast-moving, deep Jordan river, God stopped the Jordan river about 18 miles upriver. About two million people crossed over the dry river bottom in one day. This was a miracle only God could have accomplished. One man from each tribe picked up a rock from the river bottom. They built a memorial on the other side with the 12 rocks to remember this miracle. Stop by our Sunday School room and see our memorial of 12 rocks and remember, God is faithful.

In the book of Joshua we learn the importance of the written law of God and the holiness of God. The land of Canaan is filled with cities, many kings, armies and people. The Canaanite religion was filled with corrupt and brutal practices. God commanded the Israelites to exterminate the inhabitants of Canaan because of these evils. God gave victory to Israel in the many battles of Joshua. We've covered the battle of Jericho and the battle of Ai. Our next lesson will be the battle of the five kings. God said to Joshua and to us: ***“Be strong and courageous! Do not tremble or be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.”*** There will be battles in our lives; there will be hard things we have to do. 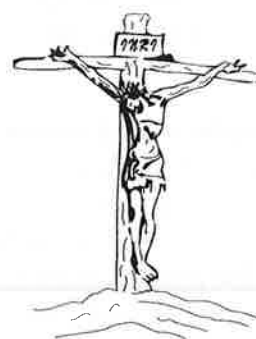

**Calvary**

**Jesus Christ, 33, of Nazareth, died Friday on Mount Calvary, also known as Golgotha, the place of the skull. Betrayed by the apostle Judas, Jesus was crucified by the Romans, by order of the Ruler Pontius Pilate. The causes of death were crucifixion, extreme exhaustion, severe**

**torture, and loss of blood.**

*Jesus Christ, a descendant of Abraham, was a member of the house of David. He was the Son of the late Joseph, a carpenter of Nazareth, and Mary, His devoted Mother. Jesus was born in a stable in the city of Bethlehem, Judea. He is survived by His mother Mary, His faithful Apostles, numerous disciples, and many other followers.*

*Jesus was self-educated and spent most of his adult life working as a teacher. Jesus also occasionally worked as a medical doctor and it is reported that he healed many patients. Up until the time of His death, Jesus was teaching and sharing the Good News, healing the sick, touching the lonely, feeding the hungry, and helping the poor.*

*Jesus was most noted for telling parables about His Father's Kingdom and performing miracles, such as feeding over 5,000 people with only five loaves of bread and two fish, and healing a man who was born blind. On the day before His death, He held a last Supper celebrating the Passover Feast, at which He foretold His death.*

*The body was quickly buried in a stone grave, which was donated by Joseph of Arimathea, a loyal friend of the family. By order of Pontius Pilate, a boulder was rolled in front of the tomb. Roman soldiers were put on guard.*

*In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that everyone try to live as Jesus did. Donations may be sent to anyone in need.*
